The generosity of the John T Reid Charitable Trusts has made it possible for the RCM to make a significant grant of up to \$10,000 to the organisation where the awardee has volunteered.

- ➤ Have volunteered their services to an organisation(s) without remuneration for a substantial amount of time.
- Normally not be a Rotarian and has not previously received major awards to recognise their contributions.
